This journey is operated in cooperation with our partners the Jumbulance Trust, represented here today, by head driver bredan (with a small b) and co-driver 'the Lovely' Martin. If talking to the drivers please do so, slowly and clearly, as it takes them about a week to become accustomed to the Soft Lowland Tongue of you Borderers. We can assist if you are in need of a translator......Gillian!

Now for the safety announcement:






